

# Reflection...

Think about this for a minute!

It is time to elect a world leader, and yours is the deciding vote. Here are

the facts about the three leading candidates:



Candidate B was kicked out of office twice, slept until noon, used opium at university, is an undiagnosed manic-depressive and drinks a bottle of whiskey every day.

Candidate C is a decorated war hero, vegetarian, doesn't smoke or drink, except for an occasional beer and has never had an extra-marital affair. Who would you choose?

Candidate A is Franklin D. Roosevelt.

Candidate B is Winston Churchill.

Candidate C is Adolph Hitler.

Sometimes the best candidate on paper is the worst leader in reality. Thank goodness Jesus did not hire a management consultancy to help him recruit his earliest disciples. On paper Peter, James and John would not have got past expressing interest in the job. Jesus recognised, however, that they had the three things necessary for Christian leadership: faith, hope and love.

Not that they had it immediately. We know they constantly misunderstood Jesus and tried to steer in other ways. They made promises they did not keep and they abandoned Jesus when the going got tough. But they had the one thing that nearly all great leaders have in their formation: a mentor who knows they are not perfect, forgives their limitations, tells them the truth, brings them back to what they are actually on about and inspires them by what he says and how he lives.

Sometimes we think the Gospel always demands a very different lifestyle to the one we have, and sometimes it does, but today's Gospel should be taken seriously, not literally. Luke tells us that the disciples 'left everything and followed him'. We know that following Jesus did not demand of Peter, for example, that he abandon his family. And we also know that the disciples returned to their work of fishing a number of times in their life with Jesus.

Luke is telling us, then, that to follow Jesus is a radical option and that we have to divest ourselves of anything that stops us serving the kingdom of God. Conversely, it follows that we have to cultivate the very things that draw us on in the Christian life. For most of us the departures necessary in following Jesus are in our hearts.

Furthermore in this story, Luke is also telling us about the great number of converts attracted to the Christian life. We know that some of these were notorious sinners. No doubt the leaders of the early Church had anxieties about admitting them.

By relating the story of the sinful Peter being called by Jesus, Luke reassures the community that as long as anyone is able to leave behind the destructiveness of their previous life they can, with guidance, become a disciple of Jesus.

Luke teaches that it is not for us to condemn anyone caught up in the net of salvation: simply to trust in God's love and compassion that visits the sick and well alike.

May we pray in this Eucharist for the humility in the Church to accept that God can turn our judgments, laws, customs, protocols and management strategies upside down and sometimes bring forward, from the most unexpected quarters, leaders who show us new dimensions to God's power shining through our human weakness.

# **Kedron Parish Pilgrimage September-October 2026**


Dear Parishioners,

This coming 2026 marks 800 years of the passing of our Franciscan Family Founder St Francis of Assisi (1226-2026). As believers, we consider our passing as our birth to eternal life with God.


Fr Joseph Nguyen, OFM



Born in 1926, Finian Perkins was the oldest Franciscan friar; entering the Novitiate in 1945. After his Ordination in 1952, he was based in Victoria and NSW before joining the Franciscan community at Kedron from 1973 to 1980. He also worked in Western Australia, Tasmania and Victoria, before returning to Kedron in 2003. Finian passed away peacefully at the Royal Brisbane Hos-

pital on 5 February 2025, following a fall at the Villa Maria Aged Care Home. Rest in peace.

You may recall it as "Brother Sun Sister Moon". The last verse being:

"Praise and bless my Lord, and give Him thanks and serve Him with great humility".

As a Parish it is wonderful to have the Franciscan charism on which to base our learning and it will be the foundation of all we do this year.

Our Sacramental Program is parish-based, family-centred and school-supported. The preparation thus relies on your commitment to attend activities that we offer, and upon your enrolment, we have clear expectations that you will participate fully in the program. # Laudato Si

"Praised Be" (Laudato Si') Brother Sun and Sister Moon. St Francis gets us to down to the atmosphere after his contemplation of our neck of the Cosmosphere (see: https://earthsci.org/ processes/weather/earth systems/

earth\_systems.html#:~:text=Cosmosphere%3A,the% 20universe%20surrounding%20the%20Earth ) - "Brothers wind and air and every kind of weather". It seems unlikely that he had warming oceans and unprecedented rain falls and floods in mind though he was well travelled. And his orientation was prayerful contemplation, praise and action. He goes on, "...by which you, Lord, uphold life in all your creatures". "Be praised, my Lord, for Sister Water, who is very useful to us and humble and precious and pure". Prayer is an almost universal attitude and response to what we sense is much bigger than ourselves (see: https:// www.catholic.org/prayers/prayer.php?p=3188). Like St Francis and like Job we wonder, we pray and like St Ignatius, we act. When we act it good indeed to be aware of our 'heaven" and Earth spheres (some say there are 17!)
